SUPPORT FOR PUPILS:



When your child joins Ysgol Gymraeg Bro Dur, care and support will be provided in a number of ways:

- A Form Tutor who will offer help in settling in to the new school and its routines and expectations.
- A Year-Group Co-ordinator (Head of Year) and Senior Staff who will always be available for discussions with parents.
- Homework and Revision clubs
- Subject-specific Clubs e.g. Mathematics.
- Focused support in Literacy and/or Numeracy
- Two parents' evenings to discuss issues such as settling in, friendships and any specific support or attention, which is needed.
- SMART targets are set and progress towards those targets are discussed every half-term with the Form Tutor.
- Encouragement to join extra-curricular activities— e.g. the Year 7
 Choir, rugby and netball tournaments, as well as whole school activities.
- Merit and Prize schemes in order to provide incentives, increase motivation and raise attainment.

Our curriculum includes a wide variety of learning experiences and enrichment activities designed to achieve the Four Purposes of the curriculum, which is to develop our children and young people into being::

- · Ethical informed citizens who are ready to be citizens of Wales and the world
- · Healthy, confident individuals who are ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society

We are determined to provide a continuum of learning that ensures our young people build on the strengths and foundations laid by our excellent primary school partners. By borrowing and developing Foundation Stage and KS2 pedagogical skills and strategies and adding teachers' subject expertise, together we will secure the foundations and structure to develop effective lifelong learners and prepare our young people for their future.



Year 7 Curriculum Plan (2023)

	Synopsis		
Amser Aur	A programme of clubs with a focus on engaging creativity, giving wider experiences and developing interpersonal skills with a particular focus on Mental and Physical Health and Wellbeing. The clubs take place on Friday afternoons for extended two-hour sessions. Pupils have the opportunity to choose the clubs they wish to join during the year.		
Celfyddydau Mynegiannol / Expressive Arts	Pupils will be taught by Drama, Art and Music performance specialists with an emphasis on cross-sectional collaboration on a common theme / output. It focuses on delivery/product at the end of the year. We aim to invite parents to come into the school to celebrate creativity in the Summer term.		
Cymraeg / Welsh	A contemporary course that looks at ethical, philosophical aspects to develop identity and encourages their linguistic development to inspire pupils as learners of the Four Purposes. There will be close collaboration between the work carried out in English and Modern Foreign Languages to develop pupils' Literacy and Communication skills.		
Dyniaethau / Humanities	Humanities lessons provide exciting opportunities for pupils to explore and explore human experiences in their own region and the rest of Wales, as well as in the wider world discovering their heritage and developing a sense of place and belonging. The Humanities cover history, geography and religion learning about their past, present and future.		
lechyd a Lles / Health and Wellbeing	This is a course that develops Health and Wellbeing in a more holistic way – looking at the physical aspects and understanding of nutrition and what we eat in order to live healthily. There will also be an emphasis on mental health, balance and healthy relationships. The focus here is firmly on developing healthy and confident individuals but responding to the principles of all four purposes.		
ITM / Modern Foreign Languages	Pupils will be introduced to French for two terms and Spanish for one term with an emphasis on developing connections between languages. We aim to develop a local, contemporary, real-world and Welsh connection to inspire pupils as learners of the Four Purposes.		
Mathemateg / Maths	By developing a local, contemporary, real-world and Welsh connection to inspire pupils as learners of the Four Purposes, learners will develop resilience, as well as experience a sense of success and enjoyment as they overcome the challenges that arise. The focus on developing mathematical and logical activities will teach the learners and challenge the young people not to be afraid of unfamiliar or complex problems .		
Saesneg / English	A contemporary course that develops local, real and Welsh identity, understanding and connections to inspire pupils as learners of the Four Purposes. There will be close collaboration between the work carried out in Welsh and in Modern Foreign Languages to develop pupils' Literacy and Communication skills.		
STEM	STEM is a subject based on the idea of educating learners in four distinct disciplines - Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. STEM at Ysgol Gymraeg Bro Dur will integrate the four disciplines through a range of practical, challenging and fun challenges. The focus will be placed on developing the principles of the Four Purposes and subject disciplines within a local, Welsh, real-world context. The focus will be on inquisitive investigation, prediction and understanding fundamental phenomena and the basis they lay in understanding our universe. There is a focus on weaving digital skills into the work with a focus on data handling and modelling.		



Equipment

Basic equipment for Year 7 pupils will comprise a geometry set (compass, two set squares, 300 mm ruler and protractor), pencil, ink pen or ball-point, coloured pencils.

Pupils are advised not to bring expensive items to school.

The use of Tippex (or similar solvent), felt pens, mobile phones, music players/digital devices are not allowed.

ClassCharts App

The software will record your child's achievement, dedication and approach to learning. The timetable, homework, contact with the personal tutor and day-to-day information in real time will be on the app.

The school week is organised into 60 minute lessons with five lessons a day. The day also incorporates registration and assembly time, break time and a lunch hour.

ABSENCE

An explanation for all absences must be given, whatever the duration. It is essential that the school be informed of any absence, by either letter, telephone (01639 502895) or e-mail(YsgolBroDurUwchradd@npt.school). No explanation will result in an unauthorised absence being recorded. Pupils must make every effort to be punctual for registration (8.45 am). Late arrivals are recorded. Pupils arriving after registration has closed must sign in at the School Office. Parents are strongly urged not to take pupils out of school for term-time holidays.

School Buses

Pupils are conveyed to school by contracted vehicles and all transport arrangements are made by the Local Education Authority Transport Section (01639 763333) who will inform all parents of the route and times of arrival at the various pickup points. It is suggested that pupils should be at these points five minutes before the scheduled times.

Should a pupil miss the bus at the end of the day, he or she must report to the School Office.

All pupils must carry their bus passes daily.

The Local Authority's School Transport guidelines state clearly that any pupil who misbehaves on a school contract vehicle may lose his or her right to free travel.

A copy of the Authority's booklet A Guide to Transport on School Buses is available from the School Office.

School lunches

A mid-day meal is provided at the school and all pupils are urged to partake. Meals are served on a Cafeteria System and pupils have a choice of 'healthy eating' menus. Pupils pay daily for their selected choice of menu.



£2.90 daily will buy a balanced, nutritious and healthy 'set' meal, although pupils may wish to pay less or more than this sum. Pupils may bring sandwiches with them to school to eat during the mid-day break.

Toast and other small, healthy items are on sale during mid- morning break.

Parent Pay



We use a Biometric cashless catering system provided by the Trust-e Cashless system, Nationwide Retail System Limited. This system means that students and staff no longer to pay for school meals with cash. Instead they purchase their meals and snacks simply by presenting their Biometric finger code at the tills! The system also reduce queues at lunch time, and provides anonymous free school meals to pupils.

You will be able to put money on your child's account on line using a debit or credit card e.g.visa.

A Biometric consent form must be completed by parents in order for pupils to use the system.
