#### **IMPORTANT CHANGES TO PARENT MEETINGS**

As a result of the School Standards and Institutions (Wales) Act 2013, which came into enforcement on 4th May 2013, a school's governing body is no longer required to hold an annual meeting for parents.

The School Standards and Institutions (Wales) Act 2013 now enables parents of registered pupils at the school to request up to three meetings a year with the governing body by petition, providing that:

- 1. The petition contains the signatures of the required number of parents of registered pupils at the school, which is the lowest of the following:
  - a) Parents of 10% of registered pupils, or
  - b) Parents of 30 registered pupils (calculated using the number of registered pupils at the school on the date the petition is received).
- 2. The requested meeting must be to discuss a matter relating to the school.
- 3. No more than three meetings shall be held during the year in which the petition is first received.
- 4. There are enough school days left in the school year for the meeting to take place.

The partnership with My Green Valley has strengthened the co-functional relationship with the village of Ystalyfera, with a focus on litter picking and improving the local area.

A challenging year following the resignation of our Schools Liaison Police Officer, therefore we worked closely with local schools in the county to support pupils and parents in various areas. I would like to thank everyone for their support. Ospreys Rugby and Swansea City Football Club have worked with us to develop pupil self-esteem and team skills. It was great to be able to welcome our partners back to us for our PSE days, such as the Fire Brigade, Road Safety team, WCADA, Nurses, Swansea University and UWTSD, Cardiff Met, the Coleg Cymraeg and Menter laith. We invited the Gideon Society to present New Testaments to year 7 pupils followed by a service conducted by Mr. Steffan Jones of Pontardawe.

In July we had 'Open door' days across all three sites, where parents, friends, former pupils, and the local community were invited to visit the school, chat with staff, see the resources and appreciate our excellent buildings. We received very positive feedback.

Our new website is constantly updated, and it's encouraging to see increased use of the information and news shared through this platform.

### **Pupil Performance**

The education of learners taking external exams this summer was affected by disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. In recognition of this, Qualifications Wales took the decision to ask WJEC to provide an additional level of support to Welsh qualifications, as part of the transition back to pre-pandemic processes. This was provided in two ways — advance information published by WJEC in February and a specific method of grading for summer 2023. The following strategies are in place to reduce future unauthorised absences:

- Weekly monitoring by Heads of Year
- Careful tracking by the Heads of Year and the Education Welfare Officer
- Timely communication (letters) with parents
- Termly report on attendance
- Meetings to include Assistant Headteacher, Heads of Year, Education Welfare Officer, School Support Officer, to discuss pupil attendance.
- Meetings with parents to provide support / challenge where appropriate.

## Discipline

We believe that all schools have a duty to create a caring and supportive environment where it is possible for all pupils to develop happily and confidently. Our school's Positive Behaviour Policy aims to promote consistency, build staff confidence, and promote an ethos of supportive teamwork between the school, parents and external support agencies. Our aim is to ensure that we take firm, consistent and fair action with each incident to restore relationships and move forward constructively. School rules will be communicated and discussed in the registration periods and all pupils are expected to comply. Our positive behaviour promotion policy ensures that there is very little misconduct within and outside the school walls.

The school implements a clear policy in dealing with bullying issues and responds immediately if such a problem arises.

#### **Health and Safety**

We have worked closely with county Health and Safety officials throughout the year. We have ensured that all our Health and Safety processes and procedures are up to date and followed by all staff and pupils. At the Ystalyfera site we were visited by county Health and Safety officers to monitor our processes and systems: we received very positive feedback.

#### **Review of Policies**

The Governing Body reviewed and updated policies during the year, and statutory policies can be accessed on the school's website.

## **Special Educational Needs**

Our aim is to provide an inclusive education for all pupils, ensuring that all young people reach their full potential. As a 3-18 Welsh medium school on two sites, we are fortunate to have a strong and dedicated team of staff who ensure that the educational and emotional needs of all pupils are met. We have excellent dedicated sections, at Y Gilfach on the Ystalyfera site and Y Gorwel at the Bro Dur site where pupils receive small group and 1:1 intervention sessions. Mr. Aled Maddock (Ystalyfera Secondary), Mr. Robert Colwell (Ystalyfera Primary) and Miss Carys Hughes covering maternity leave for Mrs. Gwenllian Dooher (Bro Dur) are our ALN coordinators and are responsible for planning and co-ordinating provision for pupils and organising the work of the dedicated team of support staff. All statements are reviewed annually at Annual Review Meetings involving the young person, parents and relevant external agencies.

A person-centred approach is used throughout the school to ensure that the voice and opinions of children and young people are central to all decisions made. The three ALNCo's regularly use the Four + One review tool when reviewing pupils' Individual Education Plans and when holding review meetings to ensure that pupils' progress is celebrated, and pupils are challenged to progress and develop further academically and socially. Mrs. Kerys Thomas is our designated ALN Governor and Child Protection/Safeguarding Governor. During this academic year, our ALN Coordinator and Governors have fulfilled the requirements of the new Code of Practice which came into force in September 2021. We are moving pupils over to the new ALN system in line with Welsh Government guidelines.

Many pupils on the ALN Register now receive access arrangements in their external and internal exams, which ensures that they're able to fully demonstrate their understanding and knowledge of their chosen subjects. The Department runs several specialist workshops including Rapid Reading, Rocket Phonics, the numeracy workshop, Talkabout and Lego therapy, as well as individual programmes which include in-depth teaching and Speech and Language programmes.

## **Access for Disabled Pupils**

The governing body is mindful of the requirements of the Equality Act 2010 and the Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act 2018 (ALNET) in its daily activities. The school is committed to ensuring that all pupils can participate in the school curriculum and (if they wish) in activities such as after school clubs, leisure / sporting events and educational visits. All aspects of accessibility, including access to written information, are included in the planning process and accessibility plan.

#### Safeguarding and Welfare of Pupils

Our designated Child Protection Officers ensure that all pupils receive support and intervention where necessary. We have five members of staff trained as Level 3 Child Protection Officers and our Designated Safeguarding Governor (Mrs Siân Parry) provides additional support. Heads of Year, a wellbeing officer, a school counsellor, Cynnydd team and a school nurse all play vital roles in supporting pupils, and the Buddies have now re-established themselves following the Lockdown period.

#### **Healthy Schools**

During the year the school has focused on promoting healthy eating and drinking, adhering to the Healthy Eating Regulations. The Catering Manager has received Saffron Training, which ensures all meals have been nutritionally tested. We are committed to the Healthy Eating and Drinking in Schools Bill which incorporates the guidance for 'Taste for Life'. We are heading towards Phase 4 of Healthy Schools. We teach children about the importance of a balanced diet through PSE, Design Science and Technology lessons and through our new Health and Wellbeing curriculum, as well as through thematic events throughout the year.

#### **Toilets**

The school has adequate toilet facilities in all blocks. Nedd and Main Blocks (Ystalyfera) and Bro Dur have unisex toilets and in Eirion Block (Ystalyfera) there are separate toilets for girls and boys. Toilets are cleaned daily, and their cleanliness is supervised throughout the day.

## Preparing for a new curriculum

As an 'Innovative School', we have developed a clear vision for our curriculum. We have considered in detail what we should teach, how we will teach it and focused on how our provision will ensure that our learners make progress in realising the Four Purposes of the New Curriculum. As a 3-18 school we have been able to focus on understanding the learning continuum and have focused on developing the aspiration and self-confidence of our learners. As a two-site school, we have been able to work together to share best practice and ensure that the curriculum focuses on developing pupils' skills through experiences and relevant, contextual information. The 'Dysgu Gorau Dysgu Byw' curriculum was extended to year 8 at the Ystalyfera site with pupils focusing on developing their independent learning skills, self-belief, and ability to work within a team. ### Welsh

Welsh is the official language of the school, for extra-curricular activities and almost all academic lessons. The school is proud of its Welsh ethos and is taking steps to ensure this is maintained for all new cohorts of pupils. Parents are asked to support the school in this regard by encouraging their children to speak Welsh, respecting the ethos of the school, and encouraging them to always do their best to promote this key aspect. The school's Language Policy is in place, which sets clear strategic targets with the aim of developing confidence and language skills with pupils across the whole 3-18 age range. In 2021 each department

introduced a language policy, and we ensure that all staff adhere to the policies within their department which operate to realise the vision of the whole school language policy.

#### **Transition**

Cluster work continues to be a strength with cluster meetings every half term. We have a focused Cluster Development Plan that ensures we have shared ownership of a holistic approach to delivery. The cluster's 2022-23 priorities were:

- Incorporate Classroom and extracurricular Speaking and Listening Skills
- Curriculum Development for Wales
- Strengthening Health and Wellbeing education (Due to the impact of Covid-19)
- Improve the identification of needs and intervention for ALN pupils.

A full transition programme was undertaken focusing on providing face-to-face experiences for pupils across the cluster. We continued to use Microsoft TEAMS for a Modern Foreign Language transition course which was a great success with pupils developing French, Spanish, and Italian skills. Question Time sessions were held with pupils, and in the summer term Year 5 pupils had the opportunity to attend a transition day in preparation for September 2024.

#### **School Senate**

The School Senate had another successful year. Several fund-raising projects were led by the School Senate, including planning, preparing and implementing a fundraising day for Children in Need and organising a rousing show for Red Nose Day. They were very proud of the £1900 collected. As part of the activities a competition was organised for Year 7 pupils to create posters to advertise the events, so it was great to be able to involve a wide range of learners. In addition, the Senate played an active role in planning and conducting interviews for new Senate Members and new staff appointments. They also took the lead on naming the school's fields by distributing a questionnaire to the whole school. With a major focus in the school's improvement scheme on learning and teaching, the Senedd created and distributed an online questionnaire to gather pupils' views on the factors that help them learn effectively. The results were analysed by Senate members, and this will shape an important part of the learning and teaching model.

Another year of very busy work for the Senedd with each member contributing effectively.

#### Maintenance

Work to refurbish the 2G field at Bro Dur continues, as well as an annual investment to try to raise the standard of the rugby pitch, in line with county guidelines. We invested in an outdoor room in Bro Dur which expands the outdoor provision, such as Forest Schools, etc.

#### **Sports Facilities**

With all the investment over the last few years, the school has two 2G pitches, two rugby pitches, four tennis courts/netball fields (Ystalyfera site), two netball fields (Bro Dur site), two sports halls.
