Unfortunately the prom and ball couldn't be held this year again due to the circumstances, but we were able to arrange a number of activities to celebrate the end of the school period.

At the end of term our GCSE and A Level assessment results were published, and I extend my sincere congratulations to our pupils for their excellent results in such difficult circumstances.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO PARENTS' MEETINGS

As a result of the School Standards and Organization (Wales) Act 2013, which came into force on 4th May 2013, a school governing body is no longer required to hold an annual parents' meeting.

The School Standards and Organization (Wales) Act 2013 now enables parents of registered pupils at the school to request up to three meetings per year with the governing body via a petition, providing that:

1. The petition contains the signatures of the required minimum number of parents of registered pupils at the school, which is the lower of the following:
 - a) The parents of 10% of registered pupils, or
 - b) The parents of 30 registered pupils (calculated by using the number of registered pupils at the school on the date that the petition is received).
2. The meeting requested must be to discuss a matter relating to the school.
3. There will be no more than three meetings held during the year in which the first petition is received.
4. There are sufficient school days left in the school year for the meeting to be held.

Discipline

We believe that every school has a duty to create a caring and supportive environment where it is possible for every pupil to mature and develop happily and confidently. Our school Positive Behaviour Policy aims to promote consistency, build staff confidence, and promote an ethos of supportive team work between the school, parents and external support agencies. Our aim is to ensure that we take firm, consistent and fair action with all incidents to restore relationships and to move forward constructively. School rules are communicated and discussed in the tutorial lessons and all pupils are expected to comply. Our positive behaviour promotion policy ensures that there is very little misbehaviour within and outside the school walls.

The school operates a clear policy when dealing with bullying issues and responds immediately if such a problem arises.

Health and Safety

We have had two successful Health and Safety visits during the year. Both reports were excellent with all risk assessments and school procedures meeting required standards.

Review of Policies

The Governing Body reviewed and updated policies during the year, the majority of which can be found on the school website.

Special Educational Needs

Our aim is to provide an inclusive education for all pupils, ensuring that every young person achieves his/her full potential. As a 3-18 Welsh medium school on two sites we are fortunate to have a strong and committed team of staff who ensure that the educational and emotional needs of all pupils are met. We have excellent purpose built departments, Y Gilfach on the Ystalyfera site and Y Gorwel at the Bro Dur site where pupils receive small group and 1:1 intervention sessions. Mrs Rhiannon Hammond (Ystalyfera) and Mrs Gwenllian Doher (Bro Dur) are our ALNCo's and are responsible for the planning and co-ordination of provision for pupils and organise the work of the dedicated support staff. All statements are reviewed annually at Annual Review Meetings which include the young person, parents, and all relevant outside agencies.

A person-centred approach is used throughout the school to ensure that the voice and opinions of the children and young people are central to all decisions made. Both ALNCo's regularly use the Four plus One review tool when reviewing pupils' Individual Education Plans and when holding review meetings to ensure that pupils' progress is celebrated and that pupils are challenged to progress and develop further both academically and socially. Mrs Siân Parry is our designated ALN Governor and Mrs Carys Jones is our Child Protection / Safeguarding Governor. During this academic year, our ALNCo's and Governors have been preparing for the new Code of Practice which comes into effect from September 2021.

Many pupils on the ALN Register now accept access arrangements in their external and internal examinations and this ensures that they are able to fully show their understanding and knowledge in their chosen subjects. Several specialist workshops are held by the Department including Rapid Reading, Roved Ffoneg, the numeracy workshop, Talkabout and Lego therapy in addition to individual programmes which include precision teaching and Speech and Language programmes.

Pupil Welfare and Wellbeing

Our designated Child Protection Officers ensure that all pupils receive support and intervention where necessary. We have 5 members of staff trained as level 3 Child Protection officers and our designated Safeguarding Governor (Mrs Carys Jones) additionally provides support. Heads of year, welfare officer, school counsellor, the Cynnydd team and school nurse all play a vital role in supporting pupils and the Peer Mentors and Buddies will re-establish themselves as we move forward following a quiet year during lock-down. An important development has been our aim to achieve the Wellbeing Award for School. We have registered our intentions and the process has begun with questionnaires and policies submitted as a starting point.

Healthy Schools

During the year the school has focussed on promoting healthy eating and drinking, thus adhering to the Healthy Eating Regulations. The Catering Manager is undergoing Saffron Training, which ensures that all meals have been nutritionally tested. We are committed to the Healthy Eating and School Drinking Bill which incorporates the guidance for 'Appetite for Life'. We are aiming for Phase 4 of Healthy schools. We teach children about the importance of a balanced diet through PSE, Science and Design Technology lessons and through our new Health and Wellbeing curriculum, as well as through theme events throughout the year.

Toilet Facilities

The school has adequate toilet facilities in all Blocks. Nedd and the Primary blocks (Ystalyfera) and Bro Dur have unisex toilets and separate toilets for girls and boys in Eirion Block (Ystalyfera). Toilets are cleaned daily and their cleanliness is supervised throughout the day.

Preparation for new curriculum

As an Innovation School working on developing the new curriculum with Welsh Government we have developed a clear vision for our curriculum. We have considered in detail what we should teach, how we will teach it and focused on how our provision will ensure that our learners realise the four purposes. As a 3-18 school we have been able to focus on understanding the learning continuum and have focused on developing the aspiration and self-confidence of our learners. As a dual sited school we have been able to work collaboratively sharing best practice and ensuring that the curriculum focuses on developing pupils' skills through relevant, contextual experiences and knowledge.

The Welsh Language

Welsh is the official language of the school, for extra-curricular activities and almost all academic lessons. The school is proud of its Welsh ethos and is taking action to ensure that this is maintained for all new cohorts of pupils. Parents are asked to support the school in this regard by encouraging their children to speak Welsh, to respect the ethos of the school and to encourage them to do their best to promote this on all occasions. The school parliament has worked with the Menter Iaith officer on creating a Language Policy and we have clear strategic targets in our SIP aimed at developing confidence and language skills with pupils across the whole 3-18 age range.

Transition

Cluster work remains a strength with half termly cluster meetings. We have a focussed Cluster Development Plan which ensures that we have a shared ownership of a holistic approach to provision. The cluster priorities include Embedding Speaking & Listening Skills in class and extra-curricular Developing a Curriculum for Wales Strengthening Health and Wellbeing education (Due to the impact of Covid-19) Improve identification of needs and intervention for ALN pupils. Despite the restrictions faced this year, we have used Microsoft TEAMS to ensure that pupils have been able to access a variety of experiences such as Q&A with year 7 pupils, virtual lessons and a Microsoft TEAMS open evening. We held a Covid-safe transition day for every pupil, followed by Teams parent's information evenings and a series of bespoke transition activities were arranged for groups of more vulnerable pupils.

School Council / Parliament

Despite the restrictions posed upon us with Covid-19 regulations, the school parliament met successfully through Teams and worked effectively on a number of projects. They have led the work on the contents of the Meal Deal, hosting a sandwich tasting session, they have worked on the school SIP and created their own Improvement Plan with a focus on the Welsh Language. The school Parliament were extremely busy with staff appointments throughout the year, once again using TEAMS as a platform for their interviews. All the minutes of every school council meeting can now be found on the school website.

Maintenance

During 2020-21 a number of building and maintenance projects have been completed and are in the process of being completed. The phase 3 project at the Ystalyfera site is progressing well with the handover of the new building due in December. The 2G at Bro Dur has been re-laid and is now back in full use and the 2G at Ystalyfera will be completed by the end of October. We have also allocated funding to upgrade Afan building at the Ystalyfera site and are awaiting a beautiful new outdoor classroom for the Primary department.

Sporting Achievements

It's been a quiet year for the physical education department this year, but the school had plenty to be proud of. Our former pupils were the stars for once, especially during the summer months. It was excellent to be able to rejoice in the success of Ben Davies and Rubin Colwill in the Welsh football team at the Euros and it is good to see that Rubin has received a new contract in Cardiff.

On the cricket field Gwennan Davies has been part of the new competition "the 100" with the Birmingham Phoenix and continues to star with the Central Sparks. The school was finally able to claim an Olympian as one of its former disciples as Joe Brier competed in the relay in Tokyo - quite a feat. Within the school it was great to see Morgan Morse receiving a contract with the Ospreys and Gwenan Horgan stepping up to join the senior Swans cohort.

There were very few games for our teams, unfortunately, but year 7 Ystalyfera v Bro Dur was an excellent match. I hope that we will have more opportunities, and more success, in 2021-22.

Pupil Achievement/Successes

Celebrating our pupil's achievements is fundamental to our provision and we continually look for new ways of acknowledging their success. During this academic year we have introduced our weekly online achievements assemble where both pupils and staff receive praise for their contribution to school life. Pupils have been able to nominate staff and staff nominate pupils.
